What is FODEPA?

Foundation Development Plus Artibonite (FODEPA) is a non-profit, faith-based organization created by Rev. Charlenor (Charlie) Dieudonne, Senior Pastor of Evangelical Missionary Church of Haiti, whose mission is to minister to the orphaned children in Haiti.

History of Haiti

Haiti is an island located in the Caribbean. It shares the island with the Dominican Republic. This island was discovered by Christopher Columbus in 1492. Current Haitians came from West Africa where their forefathers served many gods in their "voodoo" religion. After the death of the native Indians, the French people sent for Africans and brought them to the island where they became slaves working in very hard conditions. They looked for a way to be set free.

In August 1791, a big voodoo ceremony was organized and the country was dedicated to the devil for two hundred years in order for the slaves to be set free from the French people. Since then, the devil has controlled everything in Haiti. But in 1991, the date the contract with the devil was to end, the government wanted to renew the deal. Just at the moment they were about to rededicate the country to the spirits of Arica, the Church of Jesus Christ was mobilized to cancel the plan. So on the nights of August 13 and 14, 1991, the Christians overcame the devil.

FODEPA's Goal

To remedy this situation, **FODEPA** is committed to changing things through **Education**. Education is the most important tool for the development of a country.

In Haiti, 85% of the people are illiterate. According to the Haitian constitution, the Government must take the responsibility to educate the children. However, most of the children ready to go to school in Haiti stay home because their parents are too poor to send them to school. Some of them start going to school in the middle of the year, but they cannot continue because they are so hungry.

80% of Haiti's population of 8.5 million live below the poverty line. Haiti's malnutrition rate is higher than many developmental countries and one in three Haitian children are malnourished. That's the reason why Foundation Development Plus Artibonite (FODEPA) launched this sponsorship program in order to change the situation of the orphaned children of Haiti.
