During the Lenten period our Ministers Association convened a weekly (on the Wednesdays) a series of meetings for reflections under the Theme "The Lamb of God -- from Sacrifice to Salvation." They have been well attended with believers from most of the denomination listening to preachers from other churches. The offerings help us to fund a home for mentally ill former street sleepers; the local Bible Society, and the Association.

At our last AGM Lloyd was re-elected to the Executive. This will continue to keep him occupied, much to Elaine's regret. Around our home there has been much activity recently. We are installing a wire fence--to keep out the neighbor's goats that destroy plants Elaine has planted who we get to minister as they 'visit' us. Pray we find a divine solution!

Lloyd has taken on a project requested by our former home church in Miami, Florida. This is to prepare a report of the recent Hurricane Melissa's damage. He is collecting photos, videos, and other things he can combine to tell the story. Do PRAY for him. He is not very adept at much of what is required to get it done, but he is working at it! God's grace is copious! James tells us that "If any man lacks wisdom let him ask of God who giveth to all men liberally and upbraided not." In today's English: God will give us wisdom if we ask for his help. We have found much reason to ask him recently.


We continue to give God thanks for your gracious, overwhelming financial gifts towards us. May His abundant blessings flow upon you and your family as you serve him.
