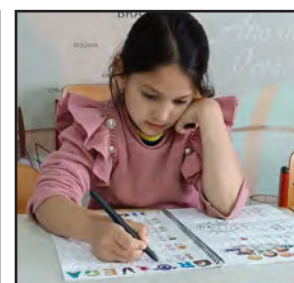

Greetings. My name is Elgin Carelock. I had the pleasure of meeting Audley McLean professionally as a business consultant in 2012. We worked together on developing a product line for his creation and became good friends during the process. Audley shared many aspects of his history including his passion for spreading God's word via a radio ministry called The Bible Speaks. I had the pleasure of listening to the radio ministry and participating in fundraising dinners and ultimately joined the Bible Speaks board of directors in August of 2013.

Over the past few years, the board considered a few candidates to take over the radio ministry with Audley being integral to the transition. Unfortunately, scheduling and other factors made it impossible for previous candidates to move forward and we continued with programming. In 2023, Audley and I were having a conversation and he mentioned that he had been praying to the Lord to determine what to do next with The Bible Speak and his successor when the Holy Spirit brought my name to his heart.

Audley told me he thought I would be natural and that he would be there the entire time to ensure my transition was not only smooth, but also consistent with God's will and way. We took the matter to the rest of the board and the vote was unanimous. We began doing shows together to introduce me to his regular listeners and I took the program over fully in February of 2024.

My vision for the Bible Speaks moving forward will be to continue to share God's word as given to me by the Holy Spirit, but with a slight twist. I will also spend time speaking to our listeners on "how" to implement God's word in their lives by sharing wisdom gained from reading, meditating on God's word, and hosting Bible scholars and theologians, to make what they are hearing in church and their spirit actionable to their daily lives.

We will use a podcast format for the initial phases to gain listeners from different age groups and parts of the world with the hope of a live interactive discussion held weekly on one of the social media platforms. Once we have established our listener base, we will consider returning to radio broadcasting in a live format.

I ask that you continue to pray for Audley and me as we move the Bible Speaks in the direction of what Jesus referred to as "greater things" and that His will be done.

My schedule is crazy full at the moment, Praise the Lord! I am currently visiting two towns, one is eight hours away and the second is an additional five hours, all by bus. When we get back to Razole, we are planning a trip to Indonesia, another trip to South Sudan, another to Uganda, and lastly a trip to Egypt. After that, I will be preaching in India for the rest of my stay here.

Let me mention a few local miracles. The first was to repair our roof on a building that seats over 1,000 people. It was going to cost \$1,000. I gave \$100 towards it and the rest came in a little at a time until we had the full amount to do the job! Praise the Lord!

The second miracle took place through a lady in the church. Her name is Kathimanda Rebekah. She agreed to pay entirely for a two day seminar for 200 pastors. This includes feeding all of them for two-days and paying the costs of having an Evangelist and another well-spoken Preacher come and preach. Everything went very smoothly. Praise the Lord!



All this traveling costs money and if you will pray and be faithful to the Lord's leading how you can be a part of what He is doing through this ministry. No gift is too small or too large! Thank you for your faithful gifts. I am estimating that I will need about \$4,000 more.

A note from Sharath

Greetings to you in Jesus name. By God's grace and through your precious prayers we are doing well. I am pleased to inform you that the ministry of our Lord Jesus is progressing well. Praise God.

Leadership Conferences - I had the opportunity to minister to the ministers in the Coastal area last week. Around twenty ministers attended. A Leadership conference was arranged a few weeks ago in Razole. Forty ministers attended. By God's grace, I minister to them. A leadership conference was arranged in a place called Katrenipadu Lanka village. Fifty ministers attended and were ministered.

House Prayers - We are conducting house prayers at every house during this season until Easter. It is a great opportunity to minister and evangelism.

Healings - Yesterday I heard a great testimony of healing through a minister. Last year I visited a village Kukunur. I stayed for a day. As we were leaving early morning a young man was brought for prayer. He is not sound in his mind. He had epilepsy. We ministered to him. I am to know he is healed.

One of our Church members named Ramesh was suffering from a kidney stone. It was very painful. The doctors found it was ten mm in size and advised for surgery. He came to our men's prayer and informed us of the report of the doctor. In his report several times he made mention of the size of the stone. His mind is occupied with the report. I said to him that he has to dwell on the Word and pray. He was healed and able to go to work.

I visited a family and two girls suffering from fever. They were unable to go to school. Since they were not taking food they were weak. When I rebuked the fever to leave them, the fever left and they are attending the school. Praise God.

God is doing so much all the time!

Haiti's situation continues to make the national news cycle. With all of the negativity in our world, we choose to look for and continue to be amazed by our Father's working hand. In the midst of the chaos, God has allowed His work to continue.

On March 13th, we received a shipment of over 2,000 lbs of supplies that we shipped back in February. We were so thankful for this opportunity that we are planning another shipment in May, Lord willing.

We are also grateful to be able to start and are nearly finished building another home. God's provision in this project is truly amazing. There are so many different tasks/conditions (i.e. materials, cash, and decent weather) that need to come together in order to complete a home build during "normal" conditions, so we are truly blessed that all these things have continued to fall into place even during such a difficult time as this.



While this home build was in progress, Gilbert, Austin's Haitian brother, has also transported several patients needing higher medical care. One of these was one Austin's Haitian sister and his newest niece, Mayah. Mayah was born with some genetic deformities. Fortunately, Gilbert was able to find a specialist in a town about a three hour drive away.



As an answer to prayer, we are now able to receive cargo at an airport nearer to our location while avoiding the more troubled areas in Haiti. This is possible through partnering with Agape, an aviation ministry.

May our Father continue to bless and keep you. Your sacrificial giving is vital to our village of Pecry. Thank you so much for your continued generosity. Please continue to pray for Haiti, and in particular for Pecry.

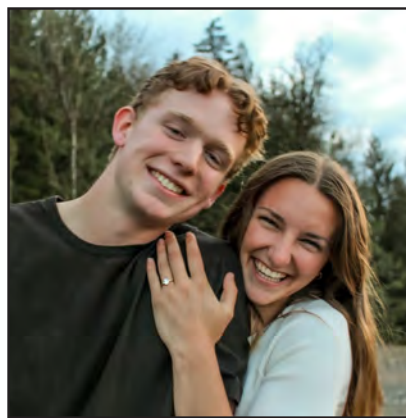

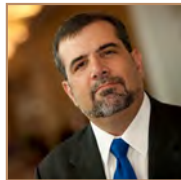

Like you we have been fixated on what is happening in Israel: and amazed by What is happening there: but we are assured that God is at work, accomplishing His plans for Israel (to turn them to their Messiah, and to turn the rage of the devil to the salvation of the Muslim, so that His word will soon “fill the earth as the waters cover the sea.” Please remember to **“pray for the peace of Jerusalem, may they prosper who love thee.” (Psalm 122:6)**

We continue to be in good health and praise the Lord for his many mercies with which He ‘daily loadeth us with His blessings’ despite our increasing years.

Elaine continues to participate in her church’s “Garage Ministry” which they began in the month of April, having ‘devotions’ with the men: reading the Scriptures, sharing a brief commentary and testimony, and praying with & for them and their families.

She says that during the month of May, celebrated as Child’s Month in Jamaica they have had a number of invitations to go into schools and speak on the topic for the month, “Stand Up, Speak Out...” against what they see as evils and wrongs.

Do pray with us about:

- Personal evangelism of the children who come into our home for ‘apples’ the Jamaican ‘Oatahie’i’ variety.
- Praise God for the many who greet us as we do our daily evening walk in the community. If Elaine is not with me, they will inquire if she is O.K. We, mostly Elaine, will often pray with groups or individuals who let us.
- Pray for many Haitians who come by boat to our easternmost point of the island, which is only 90 miles to Haiti’s southwest our tries to help them and often will give them help, while working on their requests for refugee status. Many Jamaicans have served as missionaries in Haiti. A few remain there. Our hopes and prayers are that the believers there will be able to assist in developing a new government free from the gangster gunmen who terrorize foreigners there mostly for ransom. We continue to petition the Lord to deliver the country from its past commitment to Voodoo and Spiritism. Multitudes have come to the Lord in Haiti but have had little opportunity to participate in the government.

Funerals here over the recent months have brought back to Jamaica one of our spiritual fathers: we benefited from his ministry as we hosed him for a few days.

Birthdays also brought the visit of our daughters, as they lavished their love on Lloyd, who celebrated his 82nd. They have since returned: Gail to her North Carolina home where she serves her hospital as a PA (Physician’s Assistant); Arlene has also returned to Abu Dhabi, where she is a supervising Consulting Phycologist. Please help us keep them uplifted in payer: may they find opportunities to share Christ with their patients.

Pray for Lloyd’s participation with a local denomination in a joint-writing of its two-hundred-year history. These projects take up a lot of his time. He is too busy in his retirement years.

We thank the Lord for you our friends and supporters and remember you often in our prayers. We depend upon you, even though we cannot do as much as we would wish to do.

Serving the Lord in Zimbabwe

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As many of you know, Dolly and I have been Missionaries since May 1986. We served, initially, in most parts of the English-speaking Caribbean, then in Miami from 2003 to August 2008 when the Lord moved us to Zimbabwe in Southern Africa. We are immensely grateful that our Lord, at each point, ensured that we were very certain of His leading. We are still in Zim today because He has convinced us that our work here is not done. So, until He says differently, we keep plodding on, trusting Him to lead us to those whom He wants us to work with and to show us exactly what He wants us to be doing.

Discipleship, our passion

One of the aspects of Missions that has greatly troubled us over the years is the lack of spiritual care of converts. Thus, having been led into a personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, many are left to fend for themselves. While some invariably fall through the cracks, others get involved in the activity of the local Church and little emphasis is placed on developing a growing relationship with our Lord.

Our Zim journey

Soon after our arrival here, many of the Pastors of City Churches reached out to us with words of encouragement and counsel. They also introduced us to some indigenous Pastors within and beyond Harare with whom we started Discipleship groups. We quickly learned that association with a foreigner/missionary was often considered a feather in one's cap. And such associations came with expectations. Consequently, one of our stated conditions as we made two or three-day monthly visits to these various destinations outside Harare was that each group would provide a venue and refreshments for participants while we provided our transportation, accommodation and other expenses. This helped to make them participants in the ministry rather than guests at an event. These monthly trips, often along very rugged roads, continued until the Covid epidemic.

During the Covid months, we began to meet via WhatsApp with individuals and persons from the various groups who had internet access. Post-Covid, it became more convenient and less costly to hold two, sometimes three, annual retreats in Harare. Participants are mostly those with whom we had been meeting online and in person, as well as those without internet access. At these Retreats, we provide food and accommodation while participants take care of their travel expenses. Those who are able also make small donations towards Retreat costs. Our next Retreat is scheduled for Saturday August 10th through 10 Tuesday 13th - a long weekend here.

Thank you so much for your participation in this ministry through your encouraging messages, gifts and prayers. May our heavenly Father bless you all.

Last month, Austin was informed that one of the homes we built a while back was in need of a roof due to poor quality roofing metal. Our team was able to replace it one day. Because of your generosity, we were able to meet this unexpected need. Thank you.



We are scheduled to travel back to Haiti this fall; however, this may prove impracticable if not impossible. We must trust that God has a plan for us through this season. Only He knows our future.

Thank you so much for your prayers on our behalf over the past few weeks. As some of you may know, we tried to purchase a house in Ocala, but when we wire transferred the money, it was taken by fraud. Thanks to the Lord about 90% of the money has been returned to us for which we are very thankful. We have learned from the detectives that it was a miracle that the majority of the funds were able to be frozen in the fraudulent account. Our wire transfer was in the fraudulent bank account for 2-1/2 days before the account was frozen and only about 10% was withdrawn. The detectives said that normally it is all gone within a few minutes, once a wire transfer is complete. Thank you so much for your prayers, emails and calls, which encouraged us greatly. We decided not to buy a house in Ocala at this time.

We recently had the opportunity to go to the Dominican Republic where we spent a couple of days with the Fellowship of Christian Athlete (F.C.A.) directors for the D.R. We again would appreciate your prayers as we are seeking the Lord's direction about the possibility of Harvest working alongside of F.C.A. Dominican ministry.

We have made an offer on a 23 acre piece of land in the D.R. in the Higüey area of the Dominican Republic. If the Lord allows us to get this land, the goal will be to build a Christian sports camp so that together Harvest and F.C.A. can use the facility as an outreach to both Haitians and Dominicans in the D.R.



Thank you again for your prayers and encouragement. We value your prayers greatly as we seek the Lord's guidance in the possible new opportunity for Harvest, in the Dominican Republic.

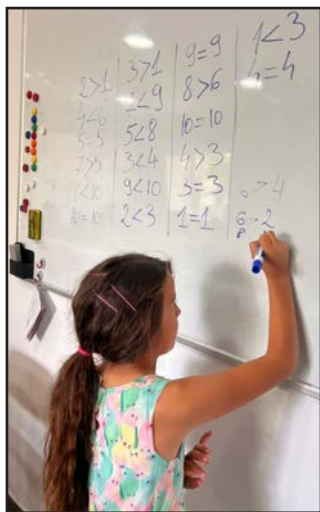

It's early September here in Jamaica, and the children are back in school. Politics is also in the air and on our newscasts as it is also in the States. Ours are not Presidential polls, just for parliamentary seats to fill vacant ones. Bye- Elections as we call them.

We were fortunate to escape the ravages of a direct hit from the recent (July 2nd.) Hurricane Beryl. Though we escaped, various of our south-coast parishes (counties) did not. We did lose electricity for nearly four (4) weeks. Some locations only got back their service last week. This means that we had no Television service, no news reports; no computer service. Even our telephone service was disrupted for quite some time.

Both Elaine and I are "retired" missionaries. So, we have little news of special activities of soul winning and of conversions. Nevertheless, we are both involved in our local churches and minister to individuals as they come our way. Among these are young children, neighbors mostly, whose goats break through our fence and nibble on our flowers and fruit trees. Many do come to feast on our fruit trees: our apples, citrus, raspberries, and star apples. Elaine has tried to help some of them learn to read. This seems to be the biggest weakness in their schools. She uses the 'old-time method of phonics, which, it seems, the schools no longer use.

Some of these children also financially help with transportation and lunch costs, which is a big Jamaican problem. There is a government scheme to help parents meet these costs for their children's education. However the parents find it difficult to access it, so we help them get registered for this program. Some who get this financial help will use it for personal and family needs, causing the children to miss days of school. One such teenager just graduated High School. Elaine invited him to stay with us for a few days which went into a week. Pray with us that he may have seen and learned something that will become a part of his life in a positive way.

Like you, we often fear the future, but then we remember the word of Jesus to us that "when we begin to see these things come to pass we must "Look up! For then our Redemption draweth near." Like David, in Psalm 73, He became envious of the wicked until he went into the Sanctuary of God "then I understood their end". (Vs. 17.) NKJV.

We were warmly greeted at the entrance of the small but clean home. After a little while, we were ushered into a room where we were formally introduced to some of the family members and renewed acquaintances with others whom we had not seen for years. Also present was a young man who is now



being discipled by our Pastor friend having previously attended a Church that preached heresy. The young man is thriving both spiritually and financially as he no longer must hand over most of his salary to unscrupulous men!



After a little tour of their home, the tiny chicken run, and the plot of land where the Church meets on a Sunday morning, we were served a nice meal. May God bless you with the spiritual understanding of His will, and with a joyful heart as you remember that He is working!

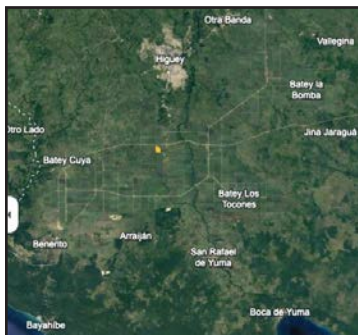

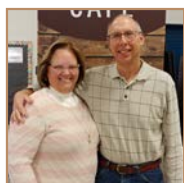

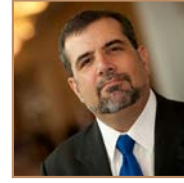

As such, we are now reducing our missionary fees to 5%! This means that every donation that comes into Harvest will have only 5% deducted for administrative fees and 95% will go directly to missionary support.

Thank you for your support and prayers for Harvest and our missionaries this year. For us, we encountered numerous roadblocks as we took steps towards beginning a new project in the Dominican Republic, so after much prayer, we withdrew from the plan to purchase land in the D.R. and again we are waiting on the Lord and seeking His direction for further ministry for Harvest.

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Why are lights such an important part of Christmas? They seem to be a necessary part of celebrating Christmas – at home, in offices or other places of business and even in public squares. Many interrupt their schedules to stop and admire and comment on them and compare them to other displays. And this happens year after year. Have we ever wondered why this is so? What is the significance of these lights?

We believe the Bible helps us arrive at a conclusion. When Christ came onto Earth as a human being, the world was covered by darkness and gloom characterized largely by instability among the nations. They would sooner consult the ungodly than God. Against this background, Isaiah was called by God to be His prophet. He testified that the Lord's strong hand was upon him, warning him not to follow the way of the people by fearing what they feared. He was to fear the Lord only and He, the Lord, would be Isaiah's and Israel's and Judah's hiding place (Is. 8). Yet, again, the Lord warned him, saying, *"When men tell you to consult mediums and spiritists, should not a people inquire of their God?"* All of this pointed to the abysmal failure of the Lord's people to trust Him alone, especially during difficult times, rather than resort to the occult – a sure indication of the depths to which they had fallen.

Such was the darkness of that time, and it is against this backdrop that Isaiah received this word from the Lord: *"Nevertheless, there will be no more gloom for those who were in distress. In the past, He humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the future He will honor Galilee of the Gentiles, by the way of the sea, along the Jordan – The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned... For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be upon his shoulders, and he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."* (Is. 9:1,2,6).

We hear the harmonious voices of the choirs: *"And He shall reign forever and ever. Alleluia! Alleluia!!"* And we shiver, not because we have the "Christmas spirit" as some would suggest, but because this is the ultimate chorus of those who know the Lord, a song of victory of good over evil, of light over darkness, of grace over law. Our Lord said, *"I am the light of the world"*. The man born blind (John 9) not only received his sight when he believed, but when the Light came and he realized that it was the Lord Himself who had healed him, He worshipped our Savior. May we not forget to worship Him too. *"Rejoice, for the Light has come!"*

Darkness continues to saturate this world. Men invent new, 'improved' and more expensive ways of doing evil, using every means at their disposal to ensure that evil predominates. When will it end, we His children ask? It ends when the Lord Jesus says, "Enough is enough!" It is His timetable that matters; His will that prevails.

So, His children walk by faith and not by sight. We tolerate but do not promote or participate in the darkness, resisting its every attempt to enslave us. And we trust the Lord who uses even the pain, sorrow and, many negative things that we all often experience to accomplish His Divine purposes for us and often, beyond. This is our motivation; it is what fuels our zeal and encourages us to keep our eyes on Him. In the process, we learn to trust Him, day by day, moment by moment until He comes; and we appreciate His grace even more. We are very privileged to have come to know the Lord and we are learning to trust Him and to follow His leading both in our personal lives and in ministry.

We are so grateful to be in the Advent of our Lord Jesus, and to Celebrate his first coming and the anticipation of his second coming. This has been a truly wonderful time of anticipation, and reflection for our family and we hope that your hearts are one with ours in this great celebration!

Unfortunately, our neighbors in Pecry have had a very difficult fall. Abundant rains fell to plant, but just as the harvest was ready to be gathered rain came again. Some people brought in their beans, hoping to have enough sunshine to dry them in their yards and others left the beans in the fields, hoping the fresh air would help dry the vines. All methods were futile; everyone's beans sprouted in the pods and are rotting. With over a month of straight rain, this weather is unprecedented. Many homes sustained damage from the prolonged damp conditions (traditional homes being built of mud and rock with a small amount of cement for plaster) and it's yet to be seen how the loss of the bean crop will affect our village and surrounding areas. Most people depend on the crop for daily food and a portion of it for re-planting, so with a complete loss for everyone in the area, it's sure to have pretty negative effects for the coming year.

In light of this, we have chosen a family for the next home-build in our village of Pecry. Their home's wall and foundation were slowly eroded over the month of heavy rain. The crew has been unable to start any preparations as of yet due to the road conditions and the rain. Please pray for God's mercy for his people in Pecry. Many are suffering the same situation. We would like to build two homes, but await the end of year's report to know how much we will have available.

Austin is planning his trip to our village in January. Please pray regarding his travel plans. The airports are still closed in some areas, but the North West is open. We hope he will not have to ride a motorcycle again, but if that is God's will, please pray for his safety.

Several serious prayer requests for friends of ours:

- Madam Orenus had something like a stroke and is left mostly paralyzed. Please pray for God's grace on her and her family.
- Wilgens (our main mechanic and long-time friend) having kidney and prostate problems. His family is dependent on his income. Please pray for grace, provision and appropriate medical assistance.

Thank you so much for your faithful and generous support of our work in Haiti. Your compassion is commendable and has enabled us to extend the love and grace of Christ to SO many families this year. 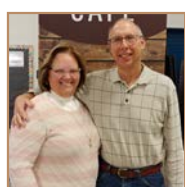

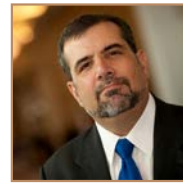

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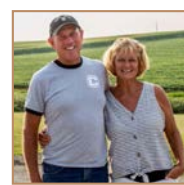
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
